According to the World Travel and Tourism Council (1997), the economics of the 21st century will be dominated by three industries: telecommunications, information technology, and tourism. The travel and tourism industries have grown by 500% in the last 25 years and it is estimated that by the year 2007 tourists will spend US \$884 billion in foreign countries on tourism related activities.

Travel and tourism represents a broad range of related industries. The growth of these industries has opened up many new job opportunities for graduates in areas such as:

THE TRAVEL & TOURISM BOOM IN INDIA

It is boom time for India's Tourism and Hospitality sector. Driven by a surge in business traveler arrivals and a soaring interest in India as a tourist destination, the year 2005 has been the best

year till date, with foreign visitor arrivals reaching a record 3.92 million, resulting in international tourism receipts of US\$ 5.7 billion.

The tourism sector in India is witnessing an impressive growth curve.

- Foreign tourist arrivals grew by 17.3 percent in 2003-04.
- The total number amounted to 28.79 lakhs as against 24.54 in the year before.
- The Foreign exchange earnings grew at the rate of 30.2 per cent during the year 2003-04 as compared to 4.1 per cent during the corresponding period of 2002-03, indicating a step up in the average tourist spending.
- India's strong GDP performance.
- Strengthening of ties with the developed world.
- Opening of sectors of the economy to private sector/ foreign investment.
- Foreign tourist arrivals are expected to witness a growth of 78 per cent in 2006 over 2001 (last 5 years)
- Growth in foreign exchange earnings is expected to be of the order of 122 per cent during this period.
- As per estimates (Ministry of Tourism), on an average, about 3.1 million additional jobs per year have been created directly and indirectly in the tourism sector in the last four years.

As per WTTC (World Travel & Tourism Council),

Travel & Tourism in India in 2006 is expected to generate USD 53544.5 million of economic activity (Total Demand).

India's Travel & Tourism Economy (direct and indirect impact) in 2006 is expected to account for 5.3 % of GDP and 24349 000 jobs (5.4 % of total employment).

India's Travel & Tourism is expected to grow 8.4 % in 2006 and by 8 % per annum, in real terms, between 2007 and 2016.

THE HOSPITALITY BOOM

As per the Wikipedia:

"Hospitality is the act or practice of being hospitable, that is, the reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers, with liberality and goodwill. Hospitality frequently refers to the

hospitality industry jobs for hotels, restaurants, casinos, catering, resorts, clubs and any other service position that deals with tourists."

The hospitality sector, propelled by the Tourism and Business travel boom, is growing so fast that, according to WTO, about 300,000 rooms would be required by 2020 to cater to the rising number of Tourists to India. The requirement for hotels and the competitive quality of their services open up great opportunities in this sector.

Table 1 illustrates the new room supply expected to enter 10 key hotel markets in India. This encompasses the development of branded as well as quality independent hotels.

More than 53,000 hotel rooms, all corresponding to hotels with brand affiliation, are in various stages of planning and development in the above ten cities, and expected to enter in a phased manner by 2011.

The year 2006 witnessed approximately 1,100 rooms being added in the branded segment, which translates to a meagre 2% of the proposed supply of 53,000 rooms.

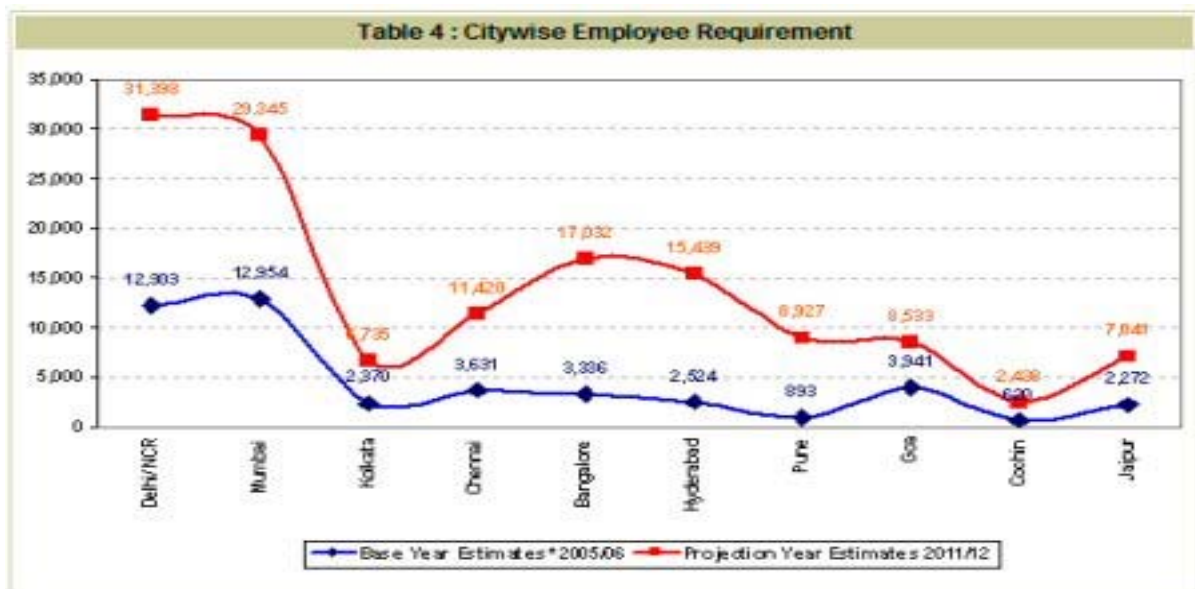
Manpower Demand

Table 3 presents the manpower requirement (across all hotels segments) by the new supply and its growth in 2006-2011.

As indicated by the above table, branded hotels in the ten selected **hotel markets would require approximately 94,000 fresh employees in the next five years**, more than twice the existing requirement. Luxury segment of hotels requires the highest number of manpower. A major chunk of demand is from cities like Delhi/NCR and Mumbai, which account for around 23% and 21%, respectively. However, the real demand will be presented by cities like Bangalore, Hyderabad and Pune. Though individually they only require around 12%, 11% and 6.5% of the demand pie, the percentage increase in manpower is the highest in these markets, ranging between 500% - 900%.
